## Cornerstone University Advanced Placement (AP)

Students may be awarded advanced placement or college credit on the basis of examination. The amount of credit and level of placement are determined by the recommendations of ACE that have been approved by the Cornerstone University Education Policy Committee. Starting Fall 2015, test scores of 3 or higher will award credit. Starting Fall 2016, credit for United States History requires a score of 4 or 5.
No charge will be assessed for the processing of credits by exam. Earning credit by exam will not be allowed for courses previously waived to allow enrollment in an advanced course. Credit will not be granted for both
